This document can be used for sessions held at managed venues or venues where there are no staff. Where the coach is ultimately responsible for health and safety there is greater onus on them to ensure that safety provision is adequate. EAP should be read in conjunction with the Risk Assessment.

Managed Venues: List the Actions that the COACH can undertake to ASSIST venue staff: Non-Managed Venues: List ALL the Actions that the COACH will undertake and manage others to do if any of the following				

situations occurs:

Evacuation:	If anyone suspects fire/gas leak/structural failure or other reason to evacuate alert all players and coaches with a sharp long whistle.
	Ensure that no-one returns to the changing rooms to collect their belongings.
	Coaches to ensure all own players evacuate and congregate in the main car park or remain on the field.
	Check all athletes accounted for.
	If anyone missing, notify any emergency services present.
	Do not re-enter the venue until instructed to do so by venue staff or Emergency Services.
Missing	For Junior members –
Person:	Alert coaches and adult MCFC members also using fields.
	Search of premises with above members.
	Contact parents – call Police.
Minor Injury:	Upon discovery of a casualty with minor injuries let the other coaches know and consider whether the casualty needs treatment and if the treatment will impact on management of coached group. If appropriate, consider handing responsibility of group to another coach temporarily while casualty is dealt with.
	First aid should only be given by a qualified First Aider.
	The first aider for the session will normally be the coach.
	Coaches should remember to consider the safety of other participants and stop / suspend the session if they are distracted by dealing with the casualty
	The First Aider should treat the casualty in line with the guidance of their qualification.
	When treating a casualty don't leave yourself in a compromising position. e.g. male first aider alone with a female casualty or adult alone with a child.
	Coaches should follow the CLUB accident reporting online procedure including noting the incident on the session plan (if applicable) and completing an incident / accident report form.

Major Injury:

(All cases of head injury should be treated as serious.)

Make all coaches aware by shouting "Coaches - Emergency"

All coaches stop session immediately.

Ensure emergency services are notified giving address at top of form.

Coach (A) nearest the reception should go and get First Aid kit and Defibrillator immediately from middle door Social Club, and bring back to casualty. Defibrillator is on the wall on the right inside the middle doors of the Pavilion, see diagram below.

Remaining coaches should (B) attend to the casualty in line with their first aid qualification, (C) take control of all other players at the field and move them away from the player.

For adult sessions it may be possible to delegate responsibility of managing the group to a committee or senior player of the club, so they can assist other coaches. It may be possible that there are medically trained individuals at the session who can provide assistance, ask if there are, but don't rely upon it.

Await arrival of emergency services, continuing to treat casualty, assist them and hand over when they have taken responsibility.

Provide Emergency services with details of any medication, known medical history and emergency contact details; these are available from applicable coach, and/or access to membership database.
