Our priority is ensuring you continue to develop and enjoy the beautiful game. As a club we invest back into players – we provide position specific coaching, use VEO to record some of our matches to develop coaches and players, and allocate funds annually to provide players football opportunities they would not necessarily be able to have. For example, in 2023 and 2025 we visited St George's Park, the home of England, for a tour and training session with FA coaches, part funded by the club.

Welfare at MCFC



As an MCFC Player you have a team of people looking after you, from your Team Coaches, 12 Committee Members and a dedicated Club Welfare Officer (CWO) whose roles are to ensure that:

- ✓ you can learn and develop your football skills
- ✓ you can work as part of a team

If you have any concerns about anything at MCFC, you can speak with your Coach who has completed various training courses to understand how we can look after you whilst you are in our care at training and matches.

You will also notice that our coaches wear the MCFC coaches kit/coats on training/match days so you know who is part of our club.

We try our best to provide a positive environment for you to learn and enjoy the beautiful game. **Being** a MCFC player, when playing football, at training or in a match, you will:

- o Always play to the best of your ability and for the benefit of my team
- o Listen and respond to what my coach/team manager tells you
- o Play fairly and not cheat, dive, complain or waste time
- o Respect your teammates, the other team, the referee and/or your coaches
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- o Be gracious in victory and defeat shake hands with opposition/referee at the end of the game
- Understand that a coach has to do what is best for the team and not one individual player
- Talk to someone you trust if you are unhappy about anything at MCFC

I understand that if I do not follow the above code of conduct, any or all of the following actions may be taken. I may:

- Be required to apologise to my teammates, the other team, referee or coach
- Receive a formal warning from the coach or the club committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club

In addition, my club, County FA or The FA may make my parent/carer aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct. The FA/County FA could also impose a fine and suspension against my club.

Our aim is to make football safe, fair, inclusive and enjoyable for all - please play your part by being supportive, positive and respectful and remember this extends beyond the football pitch.
